New Service: CD-ROM Production

CD-ROM is a cost-effective method of bulk storage for computers, and in response to demand from the University community, Prentice has introduced a new service, a facility for producing CD-ROMs.

Around 650 MB can be stored on CD-ROM in as little as 15 minutes. **Compare the convenience, cost and speed of a CD-ROM to 450 floppy disks!** The expected life a CD-ROM is 30 years, so it provides secure storage for your valuable archival data, experimental data, and other large amounts of information.

The heart of the new system is the new Yamaha CDR-100 "quad-speed" recorder. It can write CD-ROMs in many formats for Macintosh, PC and UNIX systems, including standard ISO-9660, XA, and Digital Audio.

A powerful feature of the Macintosh and PC software is its *multi-session* capability. This means that one disk can be produced over several sessions, eliminating the need of having to organise and store vast amounts of data at one time. This way, files can be copied to CD-ROM in more manageable chunks.

UQnet now a live teaching resource

Information found using UQnet, the campus computer network, can now be presented directly to your class. Plug your computer into the lecture theatre's network connection, and you can make use of some of the network resources you have in your office.

Lecturers can present information such as satellite weather maps, pictures like the comet explosions on Jupiter, movies with sound effects, scientific graphs and diagrams, and computer programs... or anything else you might display! You can even demonstrate how students can access certain information for themselves, or how to perform particular tasks.

This is possible because the first stage of the Campus Lecture Theatre Network is complete and ready for use. These are the current lecture theatres which have ethernet connections to UQnet:

• Raybould Lecture Theatres 50-1, 50-2 and 50-3 (Hawken Building)

Computing Requirements

In addition to your computer's networking software and ethernet card, lecturers will need a **personal IP number**. This allows lecturers to connect their computers from the lecture theatre to UQnet. Application forms for a personal IP (Internet Protocol) number are available from Client Service (365 4400).

Expansion Plans

At present, access is only available to UQnet, and not to host computers outside the University. Gateway software which will allow **secure** access from lecture theatres to the Internet is presently being investigated.

The Campus Lecture Theatre Network will be expanded to include many lecture theatres. Please tell us the lecture theatres where you would like this service so we can plan the expansion accordingly.
